Cultural Resource Specialist

As a Cultural Resource Specialist (CRS), you will be an integral part of our work at the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS). CRS staff are responsible for guidance and assistance regarding the conservation and protection of cultural resources in all NRCS programs and activities. Day-to-day work will include surveying and evaluating cultural sites, preparing reports and recommendations, managing projects, and consulting and working with tribal governments, local municipalities, state and university partners, and agricultural producers.

Qualifications:

A higher education degree in anthropology, history, Native American studies, or a related discipline, work as a professional archaeologist, and Secretary of the Interior Professional Qualifications may be required. However, a combination of undergraduate education and work experience may also be accepted for certain positions, or four years of archaeological work experience demonstrating a thorough knowledge of the fundamental principles and theories of professional archaeology with preference given to those that have completed an archaeological field school.

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
