Supplemental Disaster Relief Program

- Provides assistance to eligible producers for losses to
 - Crop production and quality
 - trees, bushes, and vines
 - due to wildfires, hurricanes, floods, derechos, excessive heat, tornadoes, winter storms, freeze (including polar vortex), smoke exposure, excessive moisture, qualifying drought, and related conditions
- occurring in calendar years 2023 or 2024.

SDRP – Stages

Stage 1

- covers losses previously indemnified by Federal Crop Insurance and the Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program (NAP)

Stage 2

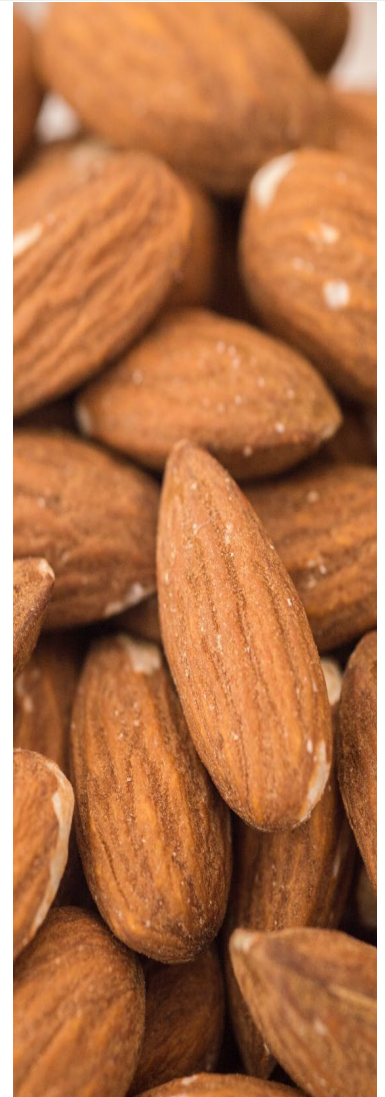
- covers both non-indemnified losses and uncovered (uninsured) losses on crops that are eligible to be covered by federal crop insurance or NAP
- includes quality adjustments

Stage 1 Quality

- quality adjustments on production to pay for quality losses in excess of losses already indemnified by crop insurance or NAP for APH/Yield based crops

Deadline

- SDRP Program Deadline – **April 30, 2026**
 - All - Stage 1, Stage 2

Disaster Assistance Programs

- **Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program**
 - NAP provides financial assistance to producers of non-insurable crops when low yields, loss of inventory, or prevented planting occur due to natural disasters.
- **Tree Assistance Program**
 - TAP provides financial assistance to eligible orchardists and nursery tree growers to replace or rehabilitate eligible trees, bushes and vines lost to natural disasters, including hurricanes and wildfires.

Disaster Assistance Programs

Livestock Indemnity Program (LIP)

- Pays for death losses due to natural disaster (tornado, blizzard, excess heat, excess cold, etc.)

Livestock Forage Program (LFP)

- Pays for grazing losses if severe drought triggers are met.



Youth Loans

- FSA can make low-interest loans to youth to establish and operate agriculture-related, income-producing, supervised projects.
- Maximum loan amount is \$10,000.
- Loan collateral consists of crops, livestock, equipment and/or other items purchased with loan funds.
- Repayment schedule is worked out with the loan officer and tailored to the project.
- Loans must be repaid within 7 years.
- A loan to raise livestock or crops must be repaid when the commodity is sold.
